



## BEINN THARSUINN WINDFARM COMMUNITY FUND INFORMATION FOR APPLICANTS

The Beinn Tharsuinn Community Wind Farm Fund (BTCWF) is a Community Benefit Fund for eligible projects in 10 beneficiary Community Council areas in the vicinity of Beinn Tharsuinn windfarm. The Community Council areas are Kiltarn, Ardross, Alness, Invergordon, Kilmuir & Logie Easter, Tain, Edderton, Ardgay, Creich, Dornoch

### ELIGIBILITY

The project must be based in or benefit at least one of the ten beneficiary communities. The funding **cannot** be used for any of the following purposes:

- ***Political, religious, entertainment or hospitality purposes***
- ***Any purpose adverse to CRE Energy Ltd's interest in the Windfarm***
- ***To finance or replace any service that we are obliged to provide***
- ***The purposes of acquiring or assisting in the acquisition of any part of the windfarm site community***

Community Councils may apply additional criteria to reflect priorities identified by the local community. Currently Kilmuir and Logie Easter Community Council gives preference to applications for under one thousand pounds and which demonstrate clear community support.

### APPLICATION PROCESS

- ***Applicants are advised to contact the Community Council to discuss proposals before applying.***
- ***The Community Council decides whether to support funding applications made for projects within their Community Council area.***
