3. Police Report On the evening of 28/04/19 one male was arrested in Milton for causing a disturbance in a public place whilst in possession of a knife. Between 24th and 30th April a quantity of heating oil was stolen from an insecure tank. Police are asking residents to be vigil and have security lighting and cctv installed as a deterrent against theft. A gravel path around tank to create noise and to check with insurance that appropriate cover is in place. Speed checks in Milton and Barbaraville have been carried out with no persons charged.

5. Matters arising from November minutes. White lines in Barbaraville still not done. Defibrillators will be installed at the Mercat centre and Milton stores within the next few weeks. Training, run by Lucky2BHere, was well attended by residents and organisers would like to thank everyone who attended. KALECC would like to thank **MM** for all her hard work in organising training etc.

6. Reports by Highland councillors the report on corporate resources has only just been published. There is a £2.5 million deficit and money needs to stop being pulled from £4.5 million reserves. TRA was visited by Gail Ross, which went well and highlighted the schools bad state of repair. Maree Todd is to visit the Academy next week where support for child learning development, addition pupil support and budget/finances will be discussed.

7. Financial accounts - £1006.98 gross in KALECC Account.

8. Community council issues. **MM** raised public concern over the amount of spraying done in and around Milton and also asked councillors to follow up the number of trees marked for felling or crowning. There was a survey done before and trees that were marked for felling were stopped from being cut down after objections from locals. Sprayer and strimming personnel have been spoken to about work carried out in Milton and grass cutting is ongoing, seasonal staff are playing catch up. HCllr's **DL** and **AR** to follow up.

9. Planning and licensing nothing this month to report.

10. Mental health and wellbeing Educational Psychologist is continuing their work at TRA to support pupils. Men's Shed gave an update on cabin improvements and membership. New gutters have been fitted and are working. New windows have been installed, with temporary shutters to help prevent damage. A fire door is to be installed. The BBQ in April went well and an open day is being planned as a thank you to everyone that has supported the Men's shed over the last couple of years. There was some damage to a newly fitted window and shutter. This was reported at the meeting to PC Smith and PC Murray. KALECC would like to thank **CG** and **DC** for their time.

11. Correspondence. A letter from Bruno Peek, pageant master, has been forwarded to CC's about the 75th VE day celebrations taking place on the 8th -10th May 2020. **RF** to promote on KALECC website.

12. AOB. SM has reported that large stones in Milton, put in by Highland council to stop drivers mounting the pavement and verge with their vehicles, are being used as an assault course by youths on bicycles. A car was damaged after being rode into. HCllr **DL** to follow up
